1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to give you the AGM Notice, and information regarding resolutions to be proposed at the AGM relating to (i) the re-election of Directors and (ii) the granting to the Directors of general mandates to issue and buy back Shares.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

2. RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

Pursuant to Article 116 of the Articles, Mr. Cha Mou Daid, Johnson, Mr. Chan Pak Joe and Dr. Sun Tai Lun shall retire from office by rotation at the AGM. Pursuant to Article 99 of the Articles, Dr. Zhang Wei, who was appointed by the Board on 25 June 2019, shall hold office until the AGM. All the retiring Directors, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election at the AGM.

Mr. Chan Pak Joe and Dr. Sun Tai Lun have served on the Board as independent non-executive Directors for more than 9 years. They meet the independence factors set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules and are not involved in the daily management of the Company. Mr. Chan Pak Joe and Dr. Sun Tai Lun have extensive commercial experience and knowledge and in-depth understanding of the business of the Group. They, as independent non-executive Directors, have given independent guidance to the Company over the years. Taking into consideration of their independent scope of works in the past years, the Directors consider that the long service of Mr. Chan Pak Joe and Dr. Sun Tai Lun would not affect their exercise of independent judgement and are satisfied that each of them has the required character, integrity and experience to continue fulfilling the role of an independent non-executive Director.

The Nomination Committee of the Company has reviewed the structure, size and composition of the Board, as well as the biographies of the retiring Directors with reference to the Company's board diversity policy. It is considered that the retiring Directors possess extensive experience and knowledge in their respective professional and commercial fields, who can contribute valuable advice on the business and development of the Group and conform with the Company's board diversity policy. The Board, taking into account the contributions of the retiring Directors to the Board and the Group during their tenure and their individual attributes enhancing the Board's diversity and optimal composition, accepted the recommendations from the Nomination Committee and recommends to the Shareholders the proposed re-election of Mr. Cha Mou Daid, Johnson, Dr. Zhang Wei, Mr. Chan Pak Joe and Dr. Sun Tai Lun at the AGM.

Details of the retiring Directors are set out in Appendix I to this circular.

3. PROPOSED GENERAL MANDATE TO ISSUE NEW SHARES

At the last annual general meeting of the Company held on 21 August 2018, a general mandate was given to the Directors to exercise the power of the Company to issue Shares. Such mandate will lapse at the conclusion of the forthcoming AGM. It is therefore proposed to seek your approval of the ordinary resolutions No. 9(A) and 9(C) as set out in the AGM Notice to give a fresh general mandate to the Directors to exercise the power of the Company to allot, issue and deal with additional Shares not exceeding the sum of 20% of the issued share capital of the Company at the date of passing of the resolution (“Share Issue Mandate”) and the nominal amount of any Shares bought back by the Company up to a maximum of 10% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of the resolution.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 1,090,845,576 Shares. On the basis that no further Shares are issued and/or bought back by the Company between the Latest Practicable Date and the date of the AGM on 27 August 2019, the Company would be allowed under the general mandate to issue Shares to allot and issue up to 218,169,115 Shares representing 20% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of the AGM.

Concerning ordinary resolutions No. 9(A) and 9(C), the Directors wish to state that they have no immediate plan to issue any new Shares. Approval is being sought from the Shareholders as a general mandate for the purposes of the Listing Rules.

4. PROPOSED GENERAL MANDATE TO BUY BACK SHARES

At the last annual general meeting of the Company held on 21 August 2018, a general mandate was given to the Directors to exercise the power of the Company to buy back Shares. Such mandate will lapse at the conclusion of the AGM. It is therefore proposed to seek your approval of the ordinary resolution No. 9(B) as set out in the AGM Notice to give a fresh general mandate to the Directors to exercise the power of the Company to buy back Shares up to a maximum of 10% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of the resolution (the “Share Buyback Mandate”).

An explanatory statement, as required by the relevant rules set out in the Listing Rules to regulate the buyback by companies with primary listings on the Stock Exchange of their own securities on the Stock Exchange, to provide requisite information to you for your consideration of the Share Buyback Mandate, is set out in Appendix II to this circular.

5. VOTING BY POLL

Pursuant to Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules and Article 80 of the Articles, the votes of Shareholders at a general meeting will be taken by poll and the Company shall announce the results of the poll in the manner prescribed under Rule 13.39(5) of the Listing Rules.

Pursuant to Article 85 of the Articles, on a poll, every member who is present in person (or, in the case of a member being a corporation, is present by its duly authorised representative or a proxy) or by proxy shall have one vote for each fully-paid share registered in his name in the register. A member entitled to more than one vote is under no obligation to cast all his votes in the same way.

6. FORM OF PROXY

The notice convening the AGM is set out on pages 16 to 21 of this circular. Enclosed with this circular is the form of proxy for use at the AGM. Whether or not you intend to attend the AGM, you are advised to read the AGM Notice and complete and return the accompanying form of proxy in accordance with the instructions printed thereon to the Company's Share Registrar in Hong Kong, Computershare Hong Kong Investor Services Limited, 17M Floor, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Wanchai, Hong Kong as soon as possible and in any event not less than 48 hours before the time appointed for holding the AGM or any adjournment thereof. Completion and return of the form of proxy will not preclude you from attending and voting in person at the AGM or any adjournment thereof should you so wish and, in such event, the form of proxy shall be deemed to be revoked.

7. RESPONSIBILITY STATEMENT

This circular, for which the Directors collectively and individually accept full responsibility, includes particulars given in compliance with the Listing Rules for the purpose of giving information with regard to the Company. The Directors, having made all reasonable enquiries, confirm that to the best of their knowledge and belief the information contained in this circular is accurate and complete in all material respects and not misleading or deceptive, and there are no other matters the omission of which would make any statement herein or this circular misleading.

8. RECOMMENDATION

The Directors consider that the above proposals relating to the re-election of Directors, the Share Issue Mandate, the Share Buyback Mandate and the extension of the Share Issue Mandate are all in the best interests of the Company and its Shareholders. Accordingly, the Directors recommend you to vote in favour of the relevant resolutions to be proposed at the AGM.

APPENDIX I DETAILS OF DIRECTORS PROPOSED FOR RE-ELECTION

The followings are the details of the Directors proposed for re-election at the AGM.

1. **Mr. Cha Mou Daid, Johnson**, aged 67, has been a non-executive Director of the Company since November 2001. Mr. Cha has over 40 years of experience in venture capital and investment management and is currently a director of C.M. Capital Advisors (HK) Limited. He is a non-executive director of HKR International Limited and China International Capital Corporation Limited (the securities of these companies are listed on Stock Exchange) and a director of CCM Capital Corporation (“CCM Capital”) and LBJ Regents Limited (“LBJ”), and a non-executive director of Mingly Corporation (“Mingly”). Each of CCM Capital, LBJ and Mingly is a substantial shareholder of the Company discloseable under Part XV of the SFO. Mr. Cha is also an independent non-executive director of Shanghai Commercial Bank Limited and a director of a number of other companies in Hong Kong and overseas. He is active in many non-profit making organizations including Qiu Shi Science & Technologies Foundation, Moral Education Concern Group, a member of the Finance Committee and of the Council of The Hong Kong University of Science and Technology and a member of the President’s Global Advisory Council at Carnegie Mellon University. He is a brother of Mr. Cha Mou Sing, Payson who is the non-executive Chairman of the Company.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Cha had notified the Company of his interests in 548,464,461 Shares and 5,192,000 option shares in the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

The term of appointment of Mr. Cha is fixed for three years which is determinable by either party on a 2-month notice, subject to the retirement by rotation provisions as set out in the Articles and the Listing Rules. Mr. Cha receives a director’s fee in the amount of HK\$100,000 per annum. Details of the amount of emoluments paid to him for the year ended 31 March 2019 are set out in the note 13(i) to the consolidated financial statements in the Company’s annual report 2018/2019.

Save as disclosed herein, Mr. Cha did not hold any directorship in other listed public companies in the last three years, and does not have any relationship with any Directors, senior management, or substantial or controlling Shareholders of the Company.

2. **Dr. Zhang Wei**, aged 64, has been a non-executive Director of the Company since June 2019 and an alternate director to Mr. Cha Mou Sing, Payson since May 2019. He is currently an executive director and the chief executive officer of Mingly. Mingly is a substantial shareholder of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO. Dr. Zhang is an alternate director to Mr. Cha Mou Sing, Payson, the non-executive chairman of Million Hope Industries Holdings Limited (“Million Hope”) and an independent non-executive director of Dadi International Group Limited (“Dadi International”). The securities of Million Hope and Dadi International are listed on the Stock Exchange. Before he joined Mingly in 2011, he had taught Development Economics and Chinese Economy at the University of Cambridge in the United Kingdom since 2000. He was also the founding director of Economic Research Centre for Greater China in Cambridge. In 1980s, Dr. Zhang worked as a government official in the People’s Republic of China (the “PRC”), among the posts he held, there were Director of Mayor’s Office in Tianjin, Secretary of the Municipal Committee of the Communist Youth League, Chairman of Tianjin Economic and Technological Development Zone (TEDA), and Chairman of Committee of Foreign Trade and Economic Relations of Tianjin Municipal Government. He was also a member of the 13th National Congress of the Chinese Communist Party. He obtained a bachelor degree in economics from Peking University, a master degree in public administration from Harvard University and a doctor of philosophy in economics from the University of Oxford.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Dr. Zhang had notified the Company of his interests in 4,288,000 Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

The term of appointment of Dr. Zhang is fixed for three years which is determinable by either party on a 2-month notice, subject to the retirement by rotation provisions as set out in the Articles and the Listing Rules. Dr. Zhang is entitled to receive a director’s fee in the amount of HK\$100,000 per annum.

Save as disclosed herein, Dr. Zhang did not hold any directorship in other listed public companies in the last three years, and does not have any relationship with any Directors, senior management, or substantial or controlling Shareholders of the Company.

3. **Mr. Chan Pak Joe**, aged 66, has been an independent non-executive Director of the Company since November 2001. Mr. Chan also serves as the chairman of the Nomination Committee and a member of the Audit Committee and the Remuneration Committee of the Company. Mr. Chan has been an executive director of The Luk Hoi Tong Company, Limited since 1973. Mr. Chan is the founder of the “Li Zhi Bursary” of Tsinghua University in the PRC. He is also the Vice-Chairman of “Love Relay Grant-in-Aid” of Fudan University in the PRC since September 2005. His community services include having served as a director of YMCA and as a member of the Remuneration Committee and the Audit Committee of the Hong Kong Housing Society.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Chan had notified the Company of his interests in 2,830,100 Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

The term of appointment of Mr. Chan is fixed for three years which is determinable by either party on a 2-month notice, subject to the retirement by rotation provisions as set out in the Articles and the Listing Rules. Mr. Chan receives a director’s fee in the amount of HK\$300,000 per annum. Details of the amount of emoluments paid to him for the year ended 31 March 2019 are set out in the note 13(i) to the consolidated financial statements in the Company’s annual report 2018/2019.

Mr. Chan did not hold any directorship in other listed public companies in the last three years, and does not have any relationship with any Directors, senior management, or substantial or controlling Shareholders of the Company.

4. **Dr. Sun Tai Lun (Alias: Dennis)**, aged 68, has been an independent non-executive Director of the Company since November 2001. Dr. Sun also serves as the chairman of the Remuneration Committee and a member of the Audit Committee and the Nomination Committee of the Company. Dr. Sun is the chairman of China-Hongkong Photo Products Holdings Limited, whose shares are listed on the Stock Exchange. Dr. Sun has extensive experience in the photographic products industry. He holds a bachelor degree in pharmacy from the University of Oklahoma, the United States of America, and a doctorate degree of philosophy in business administration from Southern California University for Professional Studies, the United States of America. He is the Vice Patron of the Community Chest of Hong Kong since 1999, the Honorary Fellow of City University of Hong Kong and Chapter Honoree of City University of Hong Kong Chapter of Beta Gamma Sigma. Dr. Sun had served as the chairman (November 2009 – October 2015) of the Advisory Committee on Travel Agents and the Court member (2010 – December 2015) of City University of Hong Kong. Dr. Sun was awarded the Bronze Bauhinia Star in 1999 and appointed as The Justice of the Peace in 2002.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Dr. Sun had notified the Company of his interests in 3,078,000 Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

The term of appointment of Dr. Sun is fixed for three years which is determinable by either party on a 2-month notice, subject to the retirement by rotation provisions as set out in the Articles and the Listing Rules. Dr. Sun receives a director's fee in the amount of HK\$300,000 per annum. Details of the amount of emoluments paid to him for the year ended 31 March 2019 are set out in the note 13(i) to the consolidated financial statements in the Company's annual report 2018/2019.

Save as disclosed herein, Dr. Sun did not hold any directorship in other listed public companies in the last three years, and does not have any relationship with any Directors, senior management, or substantial or controlling Shareholders of the Company.

Save as disclosed herein, there is no other matter that needs to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders and there is no other information relating to Mr. Cha Mou Daid, Johnson, Dr. Zhang Wei, Mr. Chan Pak Joe and Dr. Sun Tai Lun which is required to be disclosed pursuant to any of the requirements of Rule 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules.

This appendix serves as an explanatory statement, as required by the Listing Rules, to provide requisite information to you for your consideration of the Share Buyback Mandate.

SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 1,090,845,576 Shares. Subject to the passing of the relevant ordinary resolution to approve the Share Buyback Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares will be issued or bought back prior to the date of AGM, the Company would be allowed under the Share Buyback Mandate to buy back a maximum of 109,084,557 Shares, representing 10% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of the resolution.

REASONS FOR BUYBACKS

The Directors believe that the proposed granting of the Share Buyback Mandate is in the interests of the Company and its Shareholders. While it is not possible to anticipate in advance any specific circumstances in which the Directors might think it appropriate to buy back Shares, they believe that an ability to do so would give the Company additional flexibility that would be beneficial to the Company and its Shareholders as such buybacks may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at that time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per Share and/or its earnings per Share or may otherwise be in the interests of the Company, and will only be made when the Directors believe that such buybacks will benefit the Company and its Shareholders. At present, the Directors have no intention to buy back any of the Shares.

FUNDING OF BUYBACKS

Buybacks of Shares will be financed out of funds legally available for the purpose in accordance with the Articles and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands. Any buybacks by the Company may be made out of capital paid up on the Shares to be bought back, funds of the Company which would otherwise be available for dividend or distribution or out of an issue of new Shares made for the purpose of the buyback and, in the case of any premium payable on the buyback out of the funds of the Company which would otherwise be available for dividend or distribution or from sums standing to the credit of the share premium account of the Company. There would not have a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the audited accounts contained in the annual report for the year ended 31 March 2019) in the event that the Share Buyback Mandate is exercised in full. The Directors do not propose to exercise the Share Buyback Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

UNDERTAKING

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will exercise the Share Buyback Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules, the Articles and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands.

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their close associates (as defined in the Listing Rules), have any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company under the Share Buyback Mandate in the event that the Share Buyback Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

No core connected persons (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company have notified the Company that they have any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company, or have undertaken not to do so, in the event that the Share Buyback Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

TAKEOVERS CODE

If as a result of a buyback of Shares, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition of voting rights for the purpose of the Takeovers Code. As a result, a Shareholder, or a group of Shareholders acting in concert, depending on the level of increase in the Shareholder's interests, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

For the purpose of the Takeovers Code, certain members of the Cha Family (comprising, inter alios, Mr. Cha Mou Sing, Payson and Mr. Cha Mou Daid, Johnson, being the Directors) as listed below had an aggregate interest in 611,354,539 Shares, representing approximately 56.04% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the Latest Practicable Date.

- (1) These share interests comprise 383,458,740 Shares directly held by CCM Trust and 104,243,301 Shares held indirectly through Mingly and its wholly owned subsidiaries. CCM Trust is interested in 87.5% equity interest in Mingly. CCM Trust is holding the 383,458,740 Shares as the trustee of certain but not identical discretionary trusts of which members of the Cha Family (comprising, inter alios, Mr. Cha Mou Sing, Payson and Mr. Cha Mou Daid, Johnson, being the Directors) are among the discretionary objects.
- (2) These share interests comprise 61,022,931 Shares directly held by LBJ and 6,806,640 Shares held indirectly through Bie Ju Enterprises Limited, its wholly owned subsidiary. LBJ is holding the 61,022,931 Shares as the trustee of certain but not identical discretionary trusts of which members of the Cha Family (comprising, inter alios, Mr. Cha Mou Sing, Payson and Mr. Cha Mou Daid, Johnson, being the Directors) are among the discretionary objects.
- (3) These share interests comprise 26,537,925 Shares held personally and 20,321,502 Shares held by Accomplished Investments Limited and Kola Heights Limited, companies that are wholly owned by Mr. Cha Mou Sing, Payson.
- (4) These share interests are held by Mr. Cha Mou Daid, Johnson personally.

In the event that the Directors exercise in full the power to buy back Shares pursuant to the Share Buyback Mandate, the aggregate interests of certain members of the Cha Family as listed above would be increased from 56.04% to 62.27% of the issued share capital of the Company. Such an increase in the Cha Family’s aggregate interest would not apparently give rise to a mandatory offer obligation under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code. At present, so far as known to the Directors, the Directors are not aware of any consequences of any repurchases made under the Share Buyback Mandate which would give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code. The Directors do not intend to exercise the power of the Company to buy back Shares pursuant to the Share Buyback Mandate to the extent that it would reduce the aggregate amount of the issued share capital of the Company in the public hands to below 25%.
